

**Dog Control Ordinance  
Town of Industry, Maine**

DEFINITIONS. As used in this ordinance, unless the context other indicates:

- A. "DOG" shall mean both male and female dogs.
- B. "Owner" means any person or persons, firm, association or corporation owning, keeping or harboring a dog.
- C. "At large" means off the premises of the owner and not under the control of any person by means of personal presence and attention as will reasonably control the conduct of such dog.

DISTURNING THE PEACE PROHIBITED. It shall be unlawful for the owner of a dog to cause or permit such dog to disturb the peace of any person by biting, chasing, or continued barking or howling or in any other manner, or to destroy the property of any person.

RUNNING AT LARGE PROHIBITED. It shall be unlawful for a dog, licensed or unlicensed, to run at large, except when used for hunting. The owner or keeper of any dog found running at large shall be subject to the penalties provided. A dog will not be considered to be running at large if it is controlled by a leash, cord, chain, or at "Heel", or under the control of a person and obedient to the person's command, or in or within a vehicle being driven or parked or within the property limits of its owner or keeper. This ordinance shall not require leashing or restraint of any dog while on its owner's or keeper's premises.

PENALTY. Every person convicted of any provision of this ordinance shall be punished by a fine of at least TWENTY FIVE DOLLARS (\$25.00) but not more than ONE HUNDRED DOLLARS (\$100.00).
